
We are now looking for a replacement - This is an ideal time and opportunity for someone to take on this role as it is going electronic and will be linking in with the new learning platform.

First Response Training Dates

Please remember you will need to complete the online training that can be found on the learning platform. This would be best done just before you attend the face to face training, that way your first aid can be added to your record without delay. Failure to complete all parts will result in your training not being valid.

Safe Space Training

Levels 1 and 2 are available on the learning platform, please check when you are due to renew. Level 3 is still available via Girlguiding NEE on Zoom. If anyone would prefer a face to face training for any level please let me know. I will need as much notice as possible as we need at least 8 to have face to face training. Please consider every leader in your unit, who is able, completing level 3 safe space. You never know which leader a girl may choose to confide in and being prepared is always a good thing.

Updated information from latest Making Guiding happen email

Do you have a Rainbow/Brownie helper, a young external volunteer aged 13 or a Guide doing her camp permit? There are now activity sheets for them to do. The activities are called 'creating safe spaces together' and will provide them with the skills they need to think about their role, be safe, understand risks and what to do if they're concerned. This replaces the need for those doing their camp permit and young external volunteers to do their A Safe Space training.

In 2021, we reviewed A Safe Space Level 3 and updated the content to include other topics, including safety and risk management. Whilst this was taking place, we stopped accepting new applications for Recognised Prior Learning for volunteers whose day-to-day jobs included safeguarding. After consultation with volunteers, Recognised Prior Learning is no longer available as it's important that all volunteers needing A Safe Space Level 3 have the same training. If you already have a current approved RPL, you won't be affected until your A Safe Space Level 3 is up for renewal.
